American social psychologist of Polish origin considered one of the founders of modern social psychology. Professor Zajonc for over 50 years conducted research into the links between the emotional and cognitive processes among others on the relation between birth order in the family and the level of IQ, the link between thought and emotion, psychology and physiology of the human body.

Doctoral level educational programs

The ISS is running the **Interdisciplinary Doctoral Program** with individual studing tracks. Currently 57 students are enrolled, preparing their dissertations under the supervision of ISS members. Students are heavily involved in the Institute's international research programs offering hands-on training for the new generation of researchers.

ISS also co-organizes summer programs including **Warsaw International Summer Education (WISE)** and **Warsaw School of Data Analysis (WSAD)**

ISS Ph.D. students regularly participate in the **ICPSR Summer Program in Quantitative Methods**. Their visits are sponsored by the stipends from the Institute for Social Research, Weiser Center and lately The Eugene and Martha Burnstein University of Warsaw Social Science Scholars Exchange Fund. Polish General Social Survey (PGSS)

- The major ISS project, carried out by the Center for Sociological Research, PGSS program modeled on the General Social Survey and approved by the ICPSR **started in 1992** and was carried out regularly on the annual or bi-annual basis.
- It's one of the most important, **systematic and publicly accessible data set documenting the change** of social attitudes in Poland over the years of the transition period
- Alongside PGSS, ISS developed a continuous participation in the **International Social Survey Program (ISSP)** by adding common comparative modules to other regular research programs.

"Antisemitism in Europe on the Rise" (Haaretz, 20.03.2012), "24% of French harbor antisemitic attitudes" (JPost, 20.03.2012), "Antisemitism dangerously high in Europe, including Poland" (onet.pl, 20.03.2012), "Antisemitism On The Rise In Europe, According To Anti-Defamation League Report" (Huffington Post, 21.03.2012). These are some reactions of daily newspapers and news websites to an opinion poll published by the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) in March 2012. This research report, based on a survey study of 5,000 participants in seven European countries, presented mere frequencies of attitudes – such as 24% in France, 48% in Poland, 53% in Spain. The media attention to the problem shows that these numbers seem to be highly informative for the broad public. But how can one judge whether 24% is high? Or whether a rise from 20% (in France in 2009) to 24% (in 2012) is a large one?




